Jesus is better! Hebrews 5:1-9

FOLLOWING THE MESSAGE

- 1) 5:2 The high priest was not indifferent to moral lapses; neither was he harsh. He was meant to have sympathy toward those who ignorantly went astray.
- 2) 5:3 The sacrifices made by the high priest could only cover sins; they could never cleanse sins. Consequently, they had to be continually repeated—day after day, year after year. It required the sacrifice of the spotless Lamb of God for sin to be cleansed and removed.
