

## ROMANS—PART 68

### Romans 10:11-15

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July 7 & 8, 2018



1. *10:11* Even in the Old Testament, Isaiah spoke of salvation as through faith (Isaiah 28:16).
2. *10:11* Faith in Jesus utterly transforms us because it replaces fear with confidence, because it rests on God's promises.
3. *10:11* Calling on someone to save is meaningless apart from knowledge that he is worthy of trust.
4. *10:11* God has always been calling the whole world.
5. *10:11* From eternity past, God's Word has gone forth to accomplish His purposes, and it will not return void to Him (Isaiah 55:11).
6. *10:12-13* God hears the cry of anyone who calls on Him for salvation.
7. *10:12-13* In Romans 3:22, Paul made the point that there is no difference in sin; now he says there is no difference in salvation.
8. *10:12-13* There is but one God who saves people through Jesus. That means any distinctions between Jew and Greek (and all other people groups) are irrelevant.
9. *10:13* This "calling" is the response within the human heart of God's call toward us according to His purposes (8:28–30).
10. *10:13* The salvation Jesus brings is powerful through eternity, as well as now.
11. *10:14* A person must hear the gospel before they can be expected to receive it or reject it.
12. *10:14* There must be someone to proclaim (preach) the message of Jesus.
