- **1.** 12:10 This type of love is an identifier by which the world knows we belong to Jesus (John 13:35). It is uncommon, and it is humble.
- 2. 12:10 Love for your brothers and sisters in Christ is the heart of an authentic Christ-follower.
- **3.** 12:11 Our time is limited; every moment counts in order to have the greatest possible impact (John 9:4; Ecclesiastes 9:10).
