- Death remains our great enemy. But what happens when we die?
 The Bible does not give a detailed blueprint but hints about what to expect.
- 2. This future is a fixed reality based in the promise of God, not in speculation or in wishful thinking (Philippians 3:20-21; Romans 8:18).
- 3. The Bible depicts the eternal God coming into the world, taking human form in same way we live in our tents (John 1:14).
- 4. The tent is a metaphor for your human body; it is a temporary home for your eternal soul until you get your real home in Heaven.
- 5. We live as paupers on this planet, forgetting that there is a vast treasure house waiting in our near future.
- 6. Believers should long for Heaven like a hungry man longs for food.
- 7. Disease and death will dismantle your tent.
- 8. Jesus spoke of His resurrection body not as a pro-created, physical body built by the work of a man and a woman, but rather built by God (Mark 14:58; Hebrews 9:11).
- 9. The resurrection body differs radically from the physical body (1 Corinthians 15:36-49).
- 10. Will we know each other? We'll know each other as God knows us because all the imperfections of this life will be removed (1 Corinthians 13:12). In Heaven there will be no strangers.
- 11. How old will we be in heaven? Ageless
- 12. The Bible teaches that the moment we die we go directly to the presence of the Lord (2 Corinthians 5:7-8; Philippians 1:21-23).
