FOLLOWING THE MESSAGE

- 1.) In the beginning-Architect/Creator. Jesus was <u>ALREADY</u> in existence before the heavens/earth were created, He is <u>NOT</u> a created being.
- 2.) The WORD Eternal pre-existent, "...the Word was with God". Jesus is your MAKER AND REDEEMER.
- 3.) "In Him was life". Therefore, "in the beginning", before anything else but God, there was **ALREADY** life.
- 4.) "...dwelt among us"- means, "He pitched His tent", or more literally He chose to live with us.
- 5.) "...full of grace and truth". Jesus is the full expression of Grace and Jesus is the full expression of truth. All the truth to save is found in Him.
- 6.) "The Lamb of God", He is God's SACRIFICIAL LAMB.
- 7.) "...you shall be called Cephas" (which is translated Peter)." God names you and gives you a brand new start.
- 8.) "...under the Fig tree I saw you..." GOD SEES YOU, God knows you.
- 9.) Communicator. God speaks to us on our level, in the line of thinking we're **Accustomed** to, and, speaks directly within our **CAPACITY** to understand.
- 10.) God the **PROVIDER**. What Jesus provided was the best, and not in a small quantity. God is concerned with your "non-critical" problems.
- 11.) Boldness for **Purity** and Holiness in our walk with Him.
- 12.) Vs 12 The_real problem Nicodemus had with what Jesus told him was not a lack of **INFORMATION**, but rather a resistance to accept and believe what he had been told he needed to do.
- 13.) In vs 13 Jesus begins to clarify God's nature. He begins by telling us that He alone has the **TRUE KNOWLEDGE** of heaven and is therefore qualified to speak of God's plan of salvation.
- 14.) With vs 14 Jesus goes to OT to make His point clear. He pictures His death on the cross through a story of **GRACE** in which God provided a remedy for the "bite of the snake".
- 15.) In this story we see the clear analogy in which the whole world is pictured as <u>BITTEN BY SIN</u> and the effect of sin is death with only one remedy, by looking in faith to that which is lifted up on the cross.

- 16.) vs 16 "He gave His only begotten Son" means that God the Father gave the unique/one of a kind Son;
 - > the One whom He "highly exalted ... and bestowed on Him the name which is above every name" (Phil. 2:9);
 - > the One with whom He had enjoyed intimate fellowship from all eternity (John 1:1)
- 17.) JESUS himself is saying; for the entire world there's only one Savior, but only those who **BELIEVE** will receive eternal life.
