1. 15:14 The believers in Rome were not perfect, but neither were they deficient. Paul encouraged their hearts to press on and to help one another toward spiritual maturity.
2. 15:14 Every believer has the responsibility to speak into the lives of others. And none of us are so wise that we have nothing more to learn.
3. 15:16 Paul was a priest in the same way all Christians are priests; in his case, he was a minister of Jesus to the Gentiles in a priestly way.
4. 15:16 Every believer who leads a soul to Jesus presents that one as a priestly offering to the Lord.
5. 15:17-18 Paul did not boast in what he accomplished but in what Jesus accomplished through him.
6. 15:17-18 We have no right to take credit for any spiritual effect/outcome; but we have every right to boast in what God has done (2 Corinthians 10:17; 1 Timothy 1:12-13; Galatians 6:14).
7. 15:18 Responding to the gospel is a call to obedience. Obedience from the heart is a synonym for saving faith.
8. 15:20-21 God does not call every believer to be an evangelist, but He does ask you to be a witness of who Jesus is to you.
9. 15:20 God never leads you to ambitions that are purposeless.
10. 15:20-21 Where does a holy ambition come from? It comes from a personal encounter with Jesus, shaped by the Word of God.
