PARABLES—Section 3, Part 4

Luke 12:35-40 Mark Kring, Senior Pastor July 19, 2020



- At the same time that we are learning new things, we have to unlearn what is false. We can only do that by hearing God's Word accurately.
- 2. 12:40 Jesus is coming back. The Bible is as clear on the Second Coming as it was on His first coming.
- 3. The story of our world has an ending already designed by God.
- 4. 12:40 We cannot be indifferent toward the future; we must be ready.
- 5. 12:40 In the Old Testament, the term "son of man" was used to speak of the insignificance of humanity (Psalm 8:4; Ezekiel 2).
- 6. 12:40 The ancient prophets also understood it as a title that especially belonged to the Messiah who was coming (Daniel 7:13).
- 7. 12:40 Jesus was reiterating the promise that one day the Son of Man will be coming back.
- 8. 12:40 Jesus referred to Himself repeatedly as the "Son of Man," emphasizing His humanity and His Messiahship (Mark 2:10, 14:61).
- 9. 12:40 The Lord Himself uses His Second Coming as a motivation to respond to the gospel (Matthew 16:27; Luke 9:23-26).
- 10. Ever since Jesus' first coming, believers have been living with the realization that He could return at any moment (Matthew 24:36; Acts 1:6-7).
- 11. The writers of the New Testament lived in light of the reality that nothing stands in the way of His return (Titus 2:13; Hebrews 10:24-25; James 5:7; 1 Peter 4:7; 1 John 2:18; Revelation 1:1).

- 12. 12:35-39 Jesus gave three analogies of readiness:
 - Stay dressed for action—metaphor for spiritual readiness, a call to action to be ready to move and move fast
 - Keep your lamps burning—not a time to be wandering; be alert, be watchful, have everything ready
 - Be like men who are waiting for their master—looking to the horizon so you are ready to receive him
- **13.** 12:37-38 In response, the master will be thrilled and will serve them.
- **14.** How do we get ready? First, we must come to Christ (Romans 13:11-14).
- Jesus told us these things because He wants to remove our anxiety, not increase it.
- **16.** 1 Corinthians 15:51 In the Bible, a mystery refers to something that was once hidden being revealed.
