E2E: Part 14a - The Ark

Genesis 6 & 7

- 1. The Bible makes it really clear that God does not change & does not adapt to cultural changes. What God said 8,000 years ago is just as true and relevant today. (Malachi 3:6, Isaiah 40:8, 1 Samuel 15:29)
- 2. When the sin of the humans reaches its high point, grace is on display. One family among all the families on the planet was righteous in God's eyes. (Genesis 6:8, 1 Peter 3:19, Genesis 7:1)
- 3. God's attributes are perfectly balanced. If He is not 100% love, He would not be God. If He is not 100% righteous wrath, He would not be God. (Psalm 45:7, Hebrews 1:9)
- 4. God's pronouncement to Noah is that it's a violent world. The only response through the entire account is Noah doing exactly what God tells him to do. In doing everything he's commanded; his life gives evidence of righteousness.
- 5. In your walk with God there are things He will call you to that surpass your capacity to grasp in the moment. There are circumstances we find ourselves in that are beyond our understanding.
- 6. The Bible identifies 2 specific sources for the water engulfing the planet.
 - 1. The fountains of the great deep burst open (Genesis 6:11)
 - 2. The floodgates of the sky were opened (Genesis 6:11)
- 7. The global flood essentially uncreates what was originally created.
- 8. The ark was God's provision. Before the flood came, before the ark was made, before a drop of rain ever fell, the method of escape already existed in the mind of God. (2 Peter 3:3-7)
- Romans 1 speaks to the issue that if people persistently abandon God, God will abandon them. God made Himself known, but His ways have been rejected. (Romans 1:24-28)

HEBREW WORDS

Yetser (yay'-tser) a form; conception (purpose):—thing framed, imagination, work

Shachath (shaw-khath'); to decay, (causatively) ruin: - corrupt(-er, thing), destroy(-er, -uction), x utterly waste

Baqaʻ, (baw-kahʻ); to cleave; to rend, break, rip or open:—make a breach, break forth - to burst, rend (asunder), rip up, tear
